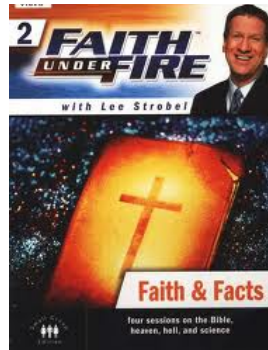


NEW Wednesday Night Short-Term Study


